Read: Psalm 73

Asaph, author of Psalm 73, was deeply disturbed and upset by the prosperity of the wicked and the oppression of the righteous. It led him to question God's goodness and greatness. He struggled with the sin of "envy."

Envy causes us to compare and compete with others in an unhealthy way. It robs us of contentment and causes us to feel ungrateful.

- What currently triggers the strongest feelings of envy for you? Is it social media, work, family, or something else?
- How does this Psalm encourage you even in your doubts? What characteristics of God are revealed in how He cares for you in your doubts?
